

YEAR 4 ACTIVITIES TO COMPLETE AT HOME

SPELLINGS

- Practise your spellings, using the Year 4 word list (or the 5 and 6 one). Use a variety of methods to practise. For example, make a wordsearch, crossword, write the words backwards, in different colours (or any other imaginative ways you can think of).
- Put your spellings into sentences. Remember to punctuate correctly.

READING

- Read every day. You could read a variety of texts, including fiction and non-fiction, magazines, comics, newspapers.
- Fill in your reading record, or design your own way of recording what you have read.
- Talk to your family about what you have read.
- Write a book review which will encourage other children to read a book which you like.

WRITING

- Keep a diary of what you do each day you are at home. This could be true, or you could make up some information to try and trick your teacher. See if we can spot what is real or not!
- Write a story. This can be about anything you like, but if you are stuck for ideas, how about basing it on a history topic, such as the Vikings or the Tudors? Perhaps you could pretend to time-travel back to these times and write about some of the adventures you have when you are there?
- Write a conversation between some Tudor people. You might choose some famous Tudors, such as Henry VIII or Elizabeth, or you can make up some characters.
- Write a character profile of a famous Tudor person. You may have to research some facts online first.
- Write a newspaper report based on the Tudor topic. You could report on the Spanish Armada (do some research first), Anne Boleyn being executed, Henry VIII marrying one of his wives, Jane Seymour's death. These are just suggestions. You can write about whatever you like!

MATHS

- Practise your multiplication tables every day. You need to know these up to 12x12. Use Times tables Rockstars or URBRAINY to do some speed tests.
- Learn how to tell the time. By the end of Year 4, you should be able to tell the time on an analogue and digital clock to the nearest minute, on a 24 hour clock.
- Get an adult to write you some addition and subtraction calculations, up to 4 digits. Solve them using the formal written method.
- Use the formal method to solve multiplication calculations, multiplying a 3 or 4 digit number by a one digit number, eg 345x9

-Teach someone else a multiplication table (you can bring this into school to do). You might make up a song, do some flashcards, make up a game etc.

HISTORY

-Research any of the following areas:

-Tudor children, Life as a courtier in Tudor times, education in Tudor times.

Present your work in any of the following ways:

Information poster or leaflet, 'Did you know' fact sheet, Powerpoint

ART

-Make a collage of a Tudor house. You could cut up newspaper and arrange it into the shape of a house. Draw the outline in pencil first.

-Design your own Tudor rose.

-Make a 3D Tudor rose.

-Draw or paint a picture of a famous Tudor person.

PE

-Do a 'standing circuit'. You could include: jogging on the spot, hopping, star-jumps etc
